In ten days, the world will celebrate International Women's Day (#IWD2023), a day that has, for more than 100 years, honored the social, economic, cultural, and

political achievements of women worldwide. It's also a day that has traditionally called for accelerating equality for women.

Equality – giving all people the same resources or opportunities – has long been a

One in five young women are married before the age of 18.

women at the individual, community, and country level.

26% of ever-partnered women over 15 years old have experienced physical and/or sexual violence.

In the first year of the pandemic, an estimated 12 million women in 115 lower- and middle-income countries experienced disruptions to family planning services, leading to an estimated 1.4 million unintended pregnancies.

Also in 2020, women's food insecurity levels were 10% higher than men's, compared with 6% higher only a year prior.

In low- and middle-income countries, 234 million fewer women than men have access to the internet on their mobile phones.

Women occupy just over one-third of local governments.

Women account for 39.4% of total employment, but during COVID-19 they represented 45% of global employment loss.

Between 2018 and 2021, only 26% of countries had comprehensive systems in place to track public allocations for gender equality.

As we take a moment to honor women worldwide, we must also look at the causes and remedies for the inequity women so gravely experience, including in health.

Just one year ago, health systems researcher Dr. Asha George said "gender inequality is man-made, which means it can be changed." I fervently agree. So, this IWD, let us understand how equity can be the path to true equality.

Wishing all women and allies in equity across all genders a very happy International Women's Day.
