Malnutrition still exerts a severe toll on global health and development, particularly for the world's most vulnerable. In 2021, 828 million people were affected by hunger, a key driver of malnutrition, 46 million more than in 2020. But amid these stark statistics, there still exist spoonfuls of comfort.


For example, in 1990, stunting impacted 40% of children under five years old worldwide. Today, it affects 22%.

And in 1990, prevalence of anemia among women of reproductive age of 15 to 49 years old was 30%. By 2010, this figure had dipped slightly to 27%, though currently progress is all but stagnant.

As you can tell, our work is not done. Quite the contrary, we must continue implementing research-backed solutions with quality and scale, as we have seen countries do to address stunting and anemia, to reach those that need it most. Whether it's increasing access to more diverse diets and micronutrient adequacy or improving feeding and care practices and household food security, or addressing infectious disease, there are solutions that have worked in places as diverse as Ethiopia and Peru, Bangladesh and the Kyrgyz Republic. I encourage you to read how Exemplar countries have addressed access to and improvements in nutrition in their own communities and see how these insights may help you cook up and replicate solutions in your own.
