TOP-LINE FINDING

Three country-level community health worker (CHW) programs in Kenya were selected for study of factors that influence the return on investment of CHW programs in routine settings.

- » There was a 10x difference in return on investment across programs, indicating some programs may be running below their potential, and that great impact is possible by optimizing existing programs.
- » Findings demonstrate that CHWs, like any worker, perform best if offered proper and reliable compensation, consistent and careful structured supervision, and tools to do their job (e.g., through commodity supplies).
- » Many CHW programs lack the data infrastructure needed to fully reveal the drivers of program performance, meaning implementers lack the regular feedback needed for improvement and optimization.



Project Status: In Progress

TOP-LINE FINDING

Kenya has been identified as an Exemplar in family planning. Research will look for drivers of change in family planning demand and voluntary modern contraceptive use.

- » Research questions explore impacts of contextual factors and supply- and demand-side policies and interventions on family planning progress, including on women's ability to make their own family planning choices.
- » Research also examines how Kenya reached vulnerable groups to increase family planning equity.
